AANHCP Step 9 Preparatory Training , Field Instruction Qualification and CP Continuing Education

Introduction

This joint student-CP education and training clinic is offered for three purposes: 1) to prepare Step 9 students for their Final Examinations; 2) to provide required continuing education for CPs who entered training prior to December, 2009; and 3) to qualify CPs wishing to become Field Instructors.

Step 9 Student and Field Instructor Clinic Attendance Requirements (3 Days)

Days 1 & 2 (Lecture)s: Students attending to fulfill a requirement (such as becoming a field instructor or for remedial education) must attend all training modules (orientation, lectures, discussions, and quizzes) during Days 1 and 2. Missing any training module will necessitate attending the next scheduled Training Clinic in order to receive full credit.

Day 3 Practicum: Students are required to attend all Day 3 training modules (overview, demonstrations, and practicum). Students will demonstrate body positioning and sequencing under live horses, and trim to the Official AANHCP Trim Guidelines; accordingly, students should bring all trimming tools, equipment and appropriate attire specified in the Guidelines.

CP Seminar Attendance Requirements (2 Days)

Days 1 & 2 Lectures: CPs should plan to attend all training modules (orientation, lectures, discussions, and quizzes) for the first two days; the 3rd day is optional unless you have been instructed to attend for additional training.

Day 3 Practicum: Any CP feeling the need to improve their body positioning and sequencing under the horse, enhance their horse handling skills, increase speed and efficiency during trimming, and clarify their understanding of the AANHCP Trim Guidelines, may attend Day 3. CPs unable to conduct a “maintenance trim” (see AANHCP Guidelines) in less than 30 minutes are particularly encouraged to attend Day 3. CPs attending Day 3 must bring all trimming tools, equipment and appropriate attire specified in the Guidelines.

Written Examination (CPs)

Successful completion of a take home written exam is required of all CP participants (the exam will be emailed after completing the Seminar). The purpose of this examination is to confirm the CP’s theoretical understanding of the materials presented during the Seminar, the required learning materials delineated in the AANHCP Training & Certification Manual for NHC Practitioners, and the Official AANHCP Trim Guidelines.

[Step 9 students will take a comparable written exam after successful completion of their Step 9 Field Examination.]
